His work has been widely produced at regional theatres throughout the country, including Actors Theatre of Louisville, Geffen Playhouse, Old Globe, Denver Center Theatre, Alliance Theatre and Pasadena Playhouse. He has adapted several classic screenplays for live performance, including ALL ABOUT EVE, CASABLANCA, ADAM'S RIB and SUNSET BOULEVARD, produced at the Hollywood Bowl with John Mauceri conducting Franz Waxman's Oscar-winning score. David has written and produced hundreds of hours of prime time television, including *Empire*, *Revolution*, V, and seven seasons of CSI: Crime Scene Investigation. In 2008, David married his longtime partner Ted Heyck; they live in Los Angeles and Lake Arrowhead, California. He holds an Honorary Doctorate from the University of N. Carolina School of the Arts.

"When I was 15 years old, I spent the summer writing and directing a play that I also produced at the Pottstown, Pennsylvania YWCA summer theatre program. (The YMCA had better athletic facilities, but no theatre; the boys I wrangled into the program and I had a lovely time with the Young Christian Women.) The show was a musical called GIVE THE LITTLE GIRL A GREAT BIG HAND, a frenetic patchwork of re-named characters and barely disguised plots from all my favorite film and stage musicals. I also wrote the score, choreographed, designed the show and played the piano when I wasn't on stage playing the second lead. While I've written other plays since then, this is the first time I've directed a piece of my own since that long ago summer on King Street.

"GOD'S MAN IN TEXAS changed my life. Jon Jory, founder and Artistic Director of Actors Theatre of Louisville selected the play to premiere at the 1999 Humana Festival. He believed in the play deeply, and blew the Humana budget on its production in the theatre's largest auditorium, seating over 700. Under the astute direction of John Dillon, and brilliant performances of three of the repertory company's finest actors, it was the hit of the festival. Within a year, GOD'S MAN IN TEXAS was one of the ten most produced plays in the country. Leonard Foglia's production at The Old Globe helped me further shape the Humana draft into the version you're seeing here. The splendid Geffen Playhouse production, richly directed Randall Arney, gave me a television career.

"William Petersen, star of *CSI:Crime Scene Investigation*, was a Chicago theatre actor. After the third season of the series, as it climbed to the number one spot in the ratings (a position it would hold for most of the next seven years), Billy wanted a playwright on the *CSI* staff. His friends and the Geffen Playhouse gave him my name. I spent the next seven seasons as one of the show's writers and producers, and haven't stopped working in television since. The television career has brought many perks, but one of the happiest is that it made it possible for me to produce this revival of GOD's MAN IN TEXAS. It's nice to be back home."
