

Founded by Nancy Keystone, Critical Mass Performance Group is a Los Angeles-based collaborative ensemble that has been developing new works and adaptations of classic texts since 1985. Known for its exuberant theatricality and historical-poetical subject matter, the ensemble was named 2013's Best Theatre Company by the LA Weekly. Our most recent, full-scale production was Alcestis. An adaptation of Euripides' play, it was developed at Getty Villa Theatre Lab, premiered at The Theatre @ Boston Court, and was named one of 2013's "10 Best Plays" by the LA Weekly, and "2013 Theatre Highlights" by LA Stage Times; it won "Best Adaptation" award from LA Weekly, LA Drama Critics Circle, and Arts In LA, and was nominated for 5 other awards.
